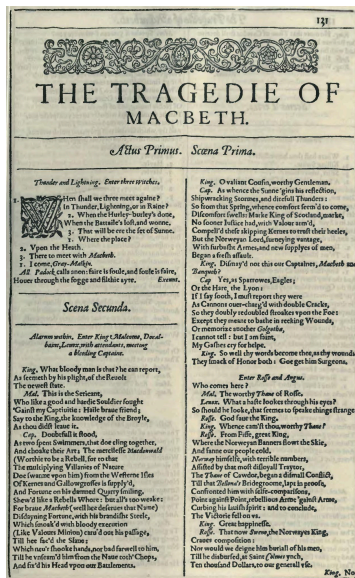


Image: The first page of Shakespeare's *Macbeth* from the First Folio (photograph by *Pastel/Kos*), licensed under CC BY-SA 4.0.
